During the play the narrator can pause the acting and ask the audience to interact with what is happening; ask them their opinion, who is acting good, who is acting bad, what to do, what should the teacher do, what punishment should be done to those who are impolite, ...

1. conclude the good and bad manners that usually students have with their teachers.	In class the teacher can discuss with the students the good manners and the bad manners they saw in the morning play. 3. make a Da`wa campaign to promote good manners.	The students can write down the above Hadeeth on pieces of paper and decorate it.
